The Mathematics Department

Mathematics is a creative and rigorous discipline with its own unique language. It transcends cultural boundaries and its importance is universally acknowledged. The department is led by Ms Vivien Canwell, who is also the Head of the Senior School. The Maths department has a strong record of high achievement in public examinations, both at GCSE and Advanced levels.

"Key Stage 3

The main objective is to consolidate, and to build upon, the basics of the subject already studied. Pupils are encouraged to think for themselves and to acquire an exploring approach to their work, while at the same time, ensuring all the fundamental concepts, old and new, have been thoroughly understood before starting their IGCSE in Form 4. All pupils cover the same syllabus topics but depth and pace may vary for a minority of weaker pupils, depending on the nature of the group and the judgement of the teacher.

Key Stage 4

Forms 4 and 5 are usually divided into two sets: a main set, and a smaller set for the pupils who find maths more difficult and would benefit from more individual attention. All pupils are normally entered for the IGCSE Higher Tier examination; a rigorous exam consisting of two 2 hour papers. The content is grouped into the following topics: Numbers and the number system; equations, formulae and identities; sequences, functions and graphs; geometry and trigonometry; vectors and transformation geometry; statistics and probability. The assessments place a high emphasis on problem solving and mathematical reasoning skills ensuring students finish their Key Stage 4 studies with a level of confidence and fluency that provides a solid foundation for the rest of their learning and working lives.





The Mathematics Department

Sixth Form

The Sixth Form at Kensington offers a wonderful opportunity for students to discover and develop their talents. It is about far more than great teaching and learning; it is about individuals thriving as they shape their characters whilst being encouraged to follow whichever path they so choose.

A Level

Mathematics is a very popular choice in the Sixth Form where students study Pure Mathematics, Statistics and Mechanics. It is a very demanding course and only suitable for high-achieving I/GCSE students. Students who wish to enter the course without a I/GCSE will be required to sit an entrance exam. All students are entered for the AS level exam at the end of the Lower Sixth and the majority continue to take the full A level at the end of the Upper Sixth.

An A Level in Further Maths may also be offered to those students who achieve a high grade in their IGCSE and who have the motivation to pursue their studies to more advanced and deeper levels of understanding.

Teaching and curriculum
